

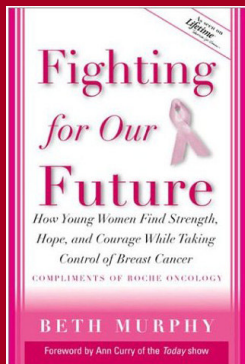

A DOCUMENTARY EYE

As an award-winning documentary filmmaker and the founder of Principle Pictures – as well as author, university professor, wife and mother – Beth Murphy brings the documentary film makers eye to the most profound challenges we face: how the best of human nature can triumph in some of our world’s darkest hours. From slavery in Sudan, environmental racism, and war crimes in Kosovo, to the fight against breast cancer, the 9/11 terror response, and post-Taliban life for women in Afghanistan, Beth serves as an advocate for those with a weakened voice.

FROM TRAGEDY, TRIUMPH

In the film “Beyond Belief,” Beth and her crew captured the inspirational story of two women who chose to rebuild themselves and the lives of women halfway around the world when the terrorist attacks of 9/11 suddenly made them widows. Her Emmy-nominated PBS special, “Heroes of Hope: Crisis in Kosovo,” tells the dramatic story of relief workers who risk their lives to help refugees survive the horrors of war.

The fight against breast cancer finds a voice of hope and a passionate champion in the Murphy-directed “Fighting for Our Future,” Lifetime Television’s Stop Breast Cancer for Life Campaign feature.
